Jay Trottier, Music Director



One only needs a brief conversation or a snippet of rehearsal to recognize Jay's overwhelming passion for music. Influenced by his mother who sang in the Tabernacle Choir at Temple Square, he began piano lessons at the age of eight and pursued clarinet and oboe in high school and college. He exercised his vocal cords as Captain von Trapp in The Sound of Music and Professor Henry Higgins in My Fair Lady, as well as serving as music director of The Music Man in community productions. Jay founded and conducted the Solano Community Symphony 30 years ago, and began directing the Temple Hill Symphony Orchestra in 2012. Though he has been instructed by Robert Lenz,

assistant director of the Utah Symphony, and Denis de Coteau, director of the San Francisco Ballet, his greatest teacher has been his heart – he simply feels music!

Jay and his wife Becky are parents of four children, and live in Fairfield, California.

MARY JULIA MCKEAN, ASSISTANT CONDUCTOR

Mary Julia McKean was raised in Beaverton, Oregon where she studied violin with Clarisse Atcherson and Jeanine Orme. She played in the Portland Youth Philharmonic throughout middle and high school and taught violin lessons in her hours after school.

After high school Mary Julia attended college at Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah, studying violin with Monte Belknap. She performed with the BYU Honor String Quartet, Philharmonic and Chamber Orchestras, as well as various bluegrass and Celtic groups, touring to China, around the United States, and the British Isles. In 2009,



she won the BYU concerto competition, performing solo with the BYU Philharmonic Beethoven's Concerto for Violin.

Mary Julia earned Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Music Education in 2011 and 2017. While at BYU she studied conducting with Kirt Saville and Don Peterson. She worked as an orchestra teacher for six years in Orem, Utah prior to her move to Vallejo, California in 2017 with her family. She is married to Alex McKean, and has two children—Douglas, three; and Teddy, five.

501st LEGION - GOLDEN GATE GARRISON

The 501st Legion is an all-volunteer, non-profit organization dedicated to bringing beloved Star Wars characters to life. PROGRAM NOTES

HOWARD SHORE

Born in 1946, Howard Shore is a Canadian composer who is notable for his film scores. He has composed the scores for over 80 films, most notably the scores for *The Lord of the Rings* and *The Hobbit* film trilogies. He won three Academy Awards for his work on the first trilogy, with one being for the original song "Into the West", an award he shared with Eurythmics lead vocalist Annie Lennox and writer/producer Fran Walsh, who wrote the lyrics. In addition to his three Academy Awards, Shore has won three Golden Globe Awards and four Grammy Awards.

JOHN WILLIAMS

Born in Long Island, New York, 1932, and residing in Los Angeles, CA, Williams has been nominated over 200 times for music from the movies by the Academy Awards and has won over 100 times in various categories for Motion Picture Music, most notably for *Schindler's List*, *Hook, E.T., Star Wars, Jaws*, and *Fiddler on the Roof*. Other famous movie scores include: *The Patriot, War Horse, Lincoln, Munich, Harry Potter, Amistad, Indiana Jones, Born on the 4th of July, Raiders of the Lost Ark* and *Saving Private Ryan*.

HARRY POTTER AND THE SORCERER'S STONE - CHILDREN'S SUITE FOR ORCHESTRA

When I wrote the full orchestra score for *Happy Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone*, I hadn't planned to write the eight miniatures presented here. The film's score did not require them, and our production schedule, usually very difficult in the film world, made no provision for their arrival.

However, if I can be permitted to put it a bit colorfully each piece seemed to insist on being "hatched" out of the larger body of the full score.

I began writing Hedwig's little piece, and each of the others followed quickly as they seemed to arrive all clamoring for their individual identities. I selected a combination of instruments that suited each theme, and this suite of pieces is the result.

Hedwig, the beautiful owl who magically and mysteriously delivers mail to Harry Potter at Hogwarts School, is musically portrayed in the first miniature by the celesta, a luminous little instrument which is capable of producing pearly, crystalline tones at dazzling speeds. The celesta begins its flight alone, but quickly is joined by the violins, possibly the only other instrument capable of attaining the dizzying pace needed to defy gravity and achieve flight.

Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry, that august institution that has trained and taught young wizards for centuries, is probably best described by the French horn section of the orchestra. No other instrument seems so perfectly suited to capturing the scholarly atmosphere of Hogwarts than the noble and stately French horn.

In the third miniature we meet Harry Potter's arch enemy, the evil Lord Voldemort, who is portrayed here by a trio of bassoons sounding their mysteriously deep and sonorous tones.

The Nimbus 2000 is Harry Potter's own personal broomstick. To musically depict this ingenious mode of transportation we have the woodwind section, with its flutes, oboes, clarinets, and bassoons, all capable of extraordinary leaps and astonishing agility, forming a perfect match for the nimble Nimbus 2000.

On the third floor of Hogwarts School we find Fluffy, the huge three-headed guard dog. Fluffy is a music lover who can only be made to fall asleep to the sound of music. Here the contra bassoon represents the snoozing Fluffy, while his music is provided by the beautiful... and in this case... soporific harp.

In the *Harry Potter* books, Quidditch is a form of intramural competition that's played on flying broomsticks. The games are conducted every year at the Hogwarts School with great pageantry, featuring colorful flags and cheering crowds. In the sixth miniature, the pomp and ceremony of these Quidditch games is best represented by the blazing brass section of the orchestra, with its tuba, French horns, trombones, and heraldic trumpets.

In the seventh miniature, "Family Portrait," the clarinet introduces the themes that relate to the disparate parts of Harry Potter's emotional life, and here it is accompanied by the cello section of the orchestra, which produces a wonderfully warm and beautiful sound.

Diagon Alley is a sort of shopping mall of the wizard world. Along with the wondrous things to be seen in the Alley, we're also transported by the sounds of antique recorders, hand drums, and percussion instruments of all kinds. There is even an elaborate solo part for the violin, cast in the role of the witch's fiddle.

With all of the miniatures presented, the suite concludes with the entire orchestra as it explores many of the themes heard throughout "Harry's Wondrous World." - John Williams

MICHAEL GIACCHINO

Born in 1967, Michael Giacchino is an American composer of music for films, television and video games. He has received an Academy Award, a Primetime Emmy Award, and three Grammy Awards. He is known for his collaborations with J. J. Abrams composing for television series Alias, Lost and Fringe, and films Mission: Impossible III, Super 8, Star Trek and its sequel Star Trek Into Darkness. His other film scores include The Incredibles, Incredibles 2, Ratatouille, Up, Cars 2, Dawn of the Planet of the Apes, Jurassic World, Inside Out, Zootopia, Star Trek Beyond, Doctor Strange, Rogue One, Spider-Man: Homecoming, Coco, War for the Planet of the Apes, Jurassic World: Fallen Kingdom, and Spider-Man: Far From Home.

Please join us in the cultural hall following the concert to meet and greet characters from Star Wars and enjoy refreshments hosted by the Hayward Stake.
